Task 1: Research the following research methods.


Summarise the advantages and disadvantages for each method.

Author/Editor	Surname, initial	Always first in bold . Surname followed by initials. Include ALL authors. Do not use et al. If book has editor enter Ed. after name. If no author, use corporate body responsible for information, e.g. RSPCA
Date of Publication	Year	Full stop after date. If no date found use: Not dated
Title	In italics	Book - Include both title and subtitle separated by a colon, all italics Journal – Article Title first,
		followed by <i>Journal Title in italics</i>
Edition	2nd 3rd 4th	Do not include this if it is a first edition
Place of Publication & Publisher	Place: publisher	Separated by a colon
Series		If there is any information relating to a series, this is placed at the end of the citation
Journal Issue Details	Volume number (part/issue)	Volume in bold part/issue number in brackets
Page Number	pp 34-43	p for single page pp for multiple pages
URL	Available from:	Full web address of the resource
