We are committed to supporting all of our students, not only during their time with us at D6A, but also in their Post-18 options and beyond.

- 170 of the 2021 Leavers followed an A level Programme (3 or 4 A levels)
- 65 students progressed to RG Universities (64 followed A level programmes)
- 10 students progressed directly to medicine degrees
- 3 students progressed directly to dentistry degrees
- 3 students progressed to Oxford University
